- 3.0 Kitchen Renovations Beginning in early April, we will be renovating our main kitchen to install a new ventilation system. The project will take approximately four months and will be in four "phases", each phase impacting a different area of the kitchen. In the last phase of the project, the cooking area of the kitchen will be shut down and we will be using a mobile kitchen. At this time, the menus will be modified slightly. During the entire period of the renovations, the Windsor Room will be unavailable for resident activities.
