








Upcoming Recreation & Pastoral Care Events

Valentines Day Heart Shaped Jello

Ingredients:

- 2 packages of jello, 3-oz each
- 1 1/4 cups boiling water
- Heart shaped cookie cutter
- Offset spatula (optional, but will make it easier)

Directions

- 1. Put the boiling water in a mixing bowl.
- 2. Sprinkle the gelatin over it and mix with a whisk until all the sugar is dissolved.
- 3. Pour in an 8 inch glass baking dish. Cover with plastic wrap.
- 4. Refrigerate until it is completely set, about 2 hours.
- 5. Cut hearts using your cookie cutter, and help release the shapes using a small off-set spatula.
- 6. You can decorate them with whipped cream and sprinkles.



Inter RAI (resident assessment Instrument) is an assessment tool being implemented by the Nova Scotia Government for all Long-Term Care facilities. Assessments are done on a quarterly basis and the results are used in care planning. The data/statistics can also be uploaded to the Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) to compare our home to other LTC facilities throughout the country. Participation is this program is now mandatory in LTC in Nova Scotia.
